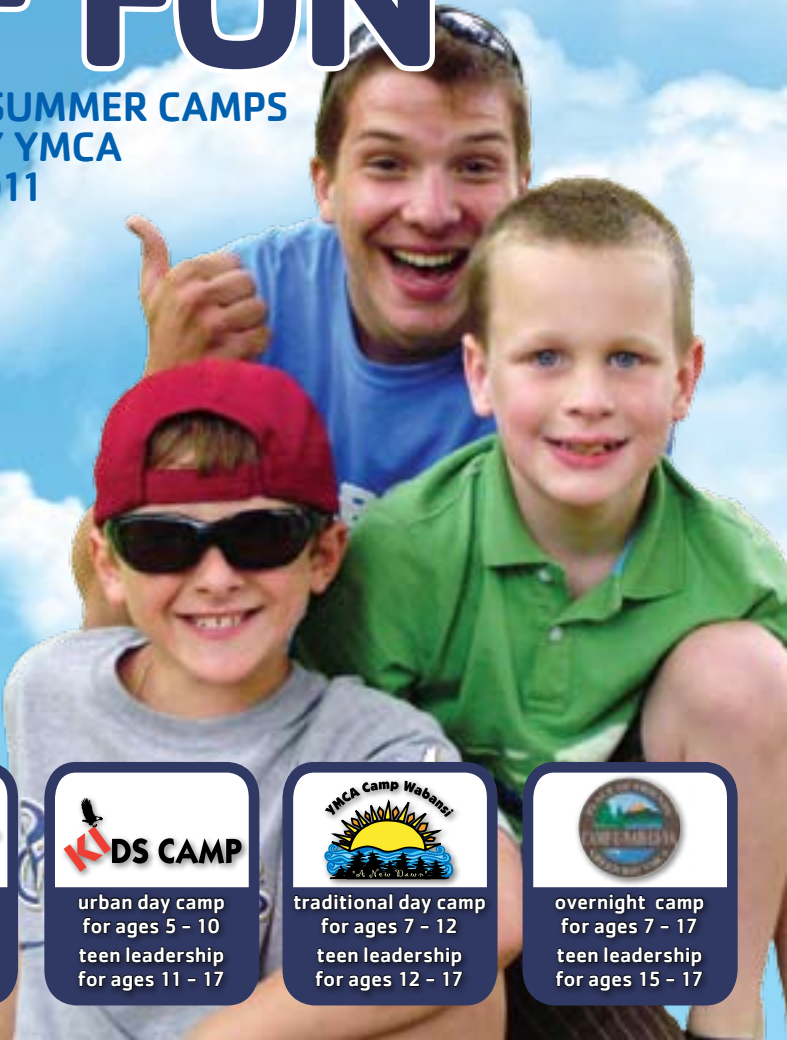

## ASSISTANT COUNSELORS (AC)

Ages 16-17

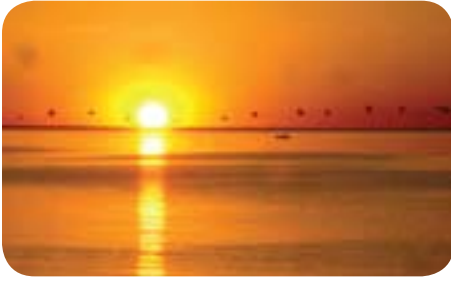


## ABOUT CAMP WABANSI

## HEALTH FORMS

Health forms are required and must be submitted to camp at least 2 weeks prior to your child's camp session. Forms are online at [www.greenbayymca.org](http://www.greenbayymca.org). The Wisconsin Department of Health and Social Services requires that each participant's immunization history be on file at the site in case of emergency.

## DAY CAMP CANCELLATION / REFUND POLICY

A two-week written notice is required to cancel your child's week of camp and receive any refund. If appropriate written notice is provided, you will receive your camp payment back minus a \$25 cancellation fee. Cancellations should be sent directly to the Camp Director. No refunds will be given with less than a two-week notice.

## CAMP FEES

The fee for your first week of camp is due in full at the time of registration. If you are registering for multiple weeks of day camp, the balance for remaining weeks of camp will be due on June 1, 2011. You must arrange for automatic credit card or bank draft payment at the time of registration.
